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SharePoint Workspace makes some information about your SharePoint Workspace account and device known to your approved contacts. For example, if you:

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- update the information in your "identity contact", or
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- Web Content Features. Features in the software can retrieve related content from Microsoft and provide it to you. Examples of these features are clip art, templates, online training, online assistance and help. You may choose not to use these web content features.
- <u>Digital Certificates</u>. The software uses digital certificates. These digital certificates confirm

the identity of Internet users sending X.509 standard encrypted information. They also can be used to digitally sign files and macros to verify the integrity and origin of the file contents. The software retrieves certificates and updates certificate revocation lists using the Internet, when available.

<u>SharePoint Workspace</u>. If the software includes Microsoft SharePoint Workspace
("SharePoint Workspace"), SharePoint Workspace will allow you to communicate directly
with others over the Internet. If you cannot communicate directly with a contact over the
Internet, and your administrator uses Microsoft's public server infrastructure, your
communications will be encrypted and sent through Microsoft servers for later delivery.
You cannot disable this service if your administrator uses Microsoft's public server
infrastructure.

SharePoint Workspace makes some information about your SharePoint Workspace account and device known to your approved contacts. For example, if you:

- add a contact to your contact list,
- import your user account onto a new device,
- update the information in your "identity contact", or
- send a SharePoint Workspace invitation using an URL to reference the invitation file,

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
