




Office gives you the freedom to work your way, whether from home, with others, or on-the-go.

Teachers and parents access and edit his shared presentation using **Office Online**.


Steve uses **Office Mobile** to keep up on all updates while running errands.

Jane is a successful business woman—working at the office, from home, or while traveling.




From her iPad®, Jane reviews the team's initial presentation.

Her boss uploads a video to include through **OneDrive for Business**.


While waiting at the gate, Jane makes a few updates using **PowerPoint** on her phone.
