Offering flexible working reduces staff turnover

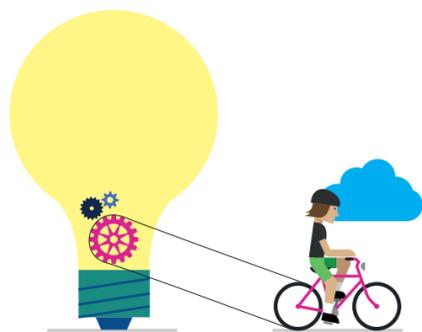
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(82%) managers reported flexible working in their organisations led to improvements in retention of staff, productivity, and commitment
