High above the Urubamba Valley in Peru lie the remains of legendary Machu Pichu. It was:

- Built by the Inca's around 1450 but abandoned 100 years later.
- Made of earthquake-proof stone walls and hand-carved granite steps.
- Named one of the seven wonders of the world.

- Over a million acres of dramatic landscape.
- A 6000 mile drop from the top.
- A place where fossils, plants and caves hold the keys to thousands of years of history.



Stonehenge, the ancient gravesite

Perhaps the most famous pile of rocks on earth, England's Stonehenge dates back to 3000 BC. On this site, archaeologists have found:

- Ancient cremated bodies indicating a sacred burial ground.
- Large, pine posts nearby from 8000 BC.
- No written language, making Stonehenge a mystery.
